We act for Morgan John Ryan, who instructs us that he has received a Summons to appear before the Parliamentary Commission of Inquiry on 5th August, 1986. We have been informed by Mr. Thompson of that Inquiry that it is unlikely that Mr. Ryan would be called to give evidence on the 5th August, 1986 and that our client will receive at least twenty-four hours' notice, through us, of when he is to attend. Our client has already given evidence both at the two Senate Hearings and at the two trials of The Honourable, Mr. Justice Murphy.

Our client is sixty-seven years of age and suffers from memory deficiency, defective hearing and prostatic prostatic. He is advised by Medical Practitioners that the last named ailment has been brought about by nervous pressure. You will, no doubt, be aware that our client has been subjected to an unprecedented Press campaign, mainly due to our client's alleged relationship and involvement with The Honourable, Mr. Justice Murphy and, also, involvement in the alleged telephone conversations colloquially known as "The Age Tapes". This naturally has brought great emotional and nervous pressure which, in turn, has contributed to his present ailments.

As a result of criminal proceedings brought against our client in 1981, he has been forced to leave his previous practice of Morgan Ryan and Brock pending the outcome of those proceedings and, accordingly, our client's income has been greatly diminished. Whatever disposable income is available to him he requires to use for defending himself in such criminal charge and, consequently, if it were necessary for him to pay for legal representation before the Commission of Inquiry, this would involve substantial hardship.

When our client gave evidence before both Senate Inquiries he was legally represented and his legal representation was paid for by those Inquiries.

It is submitted that any citizen who is called to give evidence at an Inquiry of this nature who is in our client's position of:-

1. the same age;
2. suffering from the same ailments, and
3. subject to such a Press campaign

ought, in the administration of justice and in the interests of the community and the person, be legally represented before the Commission of Inquiry. Accordingly, we are instructed to request you to authorise the provision by the Commonwealth to our client financial assistance pursuant to Section 22 of the Parliamentary Commission of Inquiry Act to enable our client, who is about to appear before the Commission, to be legally represented by the Solicitor and Counsel of his choice.

Parliamentary Commission of Inquiry Act 1986
Parliamentary Commission of Inquiry Regulations

Statutory Rules 1986 No.

(Issued under the authority of the Special Minister of State, the
Hon. M.J. Young MP)

The Parliamentary Commission of Inquiry Act 1986 (the Act) provides that the Governor-General may make regulations, not inconsistent with the Act, prescribing all matters which, are required or permitted by the Act to be prescribed or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying out or giving effect to the legislation.

The Act also provides for a member of the Parliamentary Commission to summon a person to appear before it and to produce documents referred to in the summons. It further provides that it shall be an offence for a person served with a summons "as prescribed" to fail to respond to that summons without reasonable excuse.

The Regulations prescribe the form of summons and the method of service of the summons and parallel similar provisions made under the Royal Commissions Act.

PROPOSED REGULATIONS UNDER THE PARLIAMENTARY COMMISSION OF INQUIRY ACT.

The proposed Regulations provide for the form and method of service of summons and parallel similar provisions made under the Royal Commissions Act.

Regulations 1 and 2 relate to citation and interpretation.

Regulation 3 provides for the form of a summons to appear before the Commission to be as set out in the Schedule to the proposed Regulations. The form has the following information:

- name and address of person being summonsed;
- name of the member of the Parliamentary Commission issuing the summons;
- the requirement to appear before the Commission at a specified place at a specified time to give evidence; and if required, to produce documents or things described in the Schedule; and to attend from day to day unless excused or released.

Regulation 4 provides for the manner of serving a summons-

- (a) where the person is an individual - the summons is to be handed to the person or, if the person refuses to accept it, it is to be put down in the person's presence after the person has been told of the nature of the summons;
- (b) where the person is a corporation - the summons is to be handed to an officer of the corporation above the age of 16 at the registered office or principal place of business of the corporation. If such a person refuses to accept the summons, it is to be put down in the person's presence after the person has been told of the nature of the summons.

Sub-section 11(1) of the Act provides as follows:

"Subject to sub-section 6(1), a member may summon a person to appear before the Commission at a hearing to give evidence and to produce such documents or other things (if any) as are referred to in the summons."

Sub-section 6(1) of the Act provides as follows:

"The Honourable Lionel Keith Murphy shall not be required to give evidence on a matter before the Commission unless the Commission is of the opinion that there is before the Commission evidence of misbehaviour within the meaning of section 72 of the Constitution sufficient to require an answer and the Commission has given to the Honourable Lionel Keith Murphy particulars in writing of that evidence."

Sub-section 24(1) of the Act provides as follows:

"A person served, as prescribed, with a summons to appear as a witness at a hearing before the Commission shall not, without reasonable excuse -

- (a) fail to attend as required by the summons; or
- (b) fail to attend from day to day unless excused, or released from further attendance, by a member of the commission.

Penalty: \$1,000 or imprisonment for 6 months."

The proposed Regulations provide for the form of summons and the method of service of summons. Details of the proposed Regulations are attached.



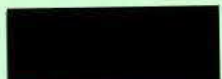
