# United Kingdom My paternal grandparents were British. Prior to first nominating for election in 2010, checks were undertaken on my behalf which confirmed that, under British law, the grandchildren of British citizens do not have an entitlement to British citizenship by descent. In addition, my mother was born in Fiji prior to Fijian independence in 1970 when Fiji was considered a British Crown colony. She therefore may have acquired British citizenship at birth. However, under British law, for children born prior to 1983, citizenship by descent only passes through the patrilineal line. As a result, I could not have acquired British citizenship by descent from my mother. Fiji My mother and her family were born in Fiji. A statement regarding the steps taken to confirm I never acquired Fijian citizenship appears at Annexure A.

# ANNEXURE A STATEMENT REGARDING FIJIAN CITIZENSHIP LAW

My mother was born in Fiji in 1930.

The Australian Labor Party has thoroughly investigated whether I may have inherited Fijian citizenship through my mother. This was first investigated when I first nominated for election in 2010 and has been reviewed as part of the ALP's strict pre-election vetting processes at the subsequent elections in 2013 and 2016.

It was determined that I have never acquired Fijian citizenship.

I was born in Australia on 16 November 1971.

At the time of my birth Fijian nationality was governed by Chapter III of the *Fijian Constitution* of 1970 (**1970 Constitution**) and the *Fiji Citizenship Act* 1971 (**1971 Act**).

Under section 22 of the 1970 Constitution, only men could automatically transmit citizenship by descent – not women.

Under section 11(1) of the 1971 Act, an application could be made to register a child born to a Fijian citizen mother as a Fijian citizen, but that application had to be made while the child was a minor.

I can confirm that no application to register to become a Fijian citizen was made on my behalf while I was a minor, or at all.

The 1970 Constitution and the legal framework established under it were abrogated with effect from 28 September 1987, following a military coup.

The military government issued the Fiji Citizenship Decree of 1987 (1987 Decree), with effect from 7 October 1987. The 1987 Decree preserved the rule that women could not transmit citizenship by descent.

A new Constitution came into force on 25 July 1990 (1990 Constitution). Chapter IV of the 1990 Constitution preserved the rule that women could not transmit citizenship by descent. The 1990 Constitution prohibited dual citizenship and provided that a person would lose Fijian citizenship if he or she acquired or retained a foreign citizenship. My mother died in 1989 but would have likely lost her own Fijian citizenship pursuant to this prohibition on dual citizenship.

A new Constitution came into force in 1997 (1997 Constitution). Pursuant to Chapter III of the 1997 Constitution, Fijian citizenship ceased to be automatically transmitted by descent, and thereafter children of Fijian citizens could only acquire Fijian citizenship by registration. The 1997 Constitution retained a prohibition on dual citizenship.

The 1997 Constitution was suspended in 2009, following a military coup in 2006.

The military government issued the Citizenship of Fiji Decree of 2009 (2009 Decree), with effect from 10 April 2009. Pursuant to section 8(1) of the 2009 Decree, the child of a Fijian citizen could apply to register as a Fijian citizen. I reiterate that I have never applied to register to become a Fijian citizen, and no such application has ever been made on my behalf.

That 2009 Decree remains in place and continues to govern Fijian nationality law.

I am and have only ever been an Australian citizen.
